CAMERON SAID HE WOULD SUPPORT REPEALING THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT

Cameron Said He Would Support Repealing The Affordable Care Act. According to MSNBC, “However, while campaigning for the GOP gubernatorial nomination in April, Cameron indicated that he wanted to see the Affordable Care Act undone. He filled out a questionnaire for Northern Kentucky Right to Life, where he answered ‘Yes’ to the question: ‘Will you actively oppose (and if in a position to do so, work against and vote against) state or federal legislation or regulation mandating health insurance coverage of abortion (both surgical and chemical) and artificial contraception, and will you actively support (and if in a position to do so, work for and vote for) the repeal of the ACA (Obamacare)?’” [MSNBC, [9/13/23](#)]

Cameron Said, “I Am Opposed To The Affordable Care Act Individual Mandate” And Would “Support Legal Challenges To The Law.” According to the Louisville Courier-Journal, “What we have seen – even from Democrats running for president this year – is that everyone is extremely unhappy with the results of Obamacare. I am opposed to the Affordable Care Act individual mandate. I do support legal challenges to the law, but before any of that happens we must determine at a state level how we will support continued protection of individuals with preexisting conditions.
